- Application of conflict-resolution strategies and the ability to work cooperatively with peers.


School & Classroom Rules

Phonemic Awareness focuses on individual sounds (phonemes) in spoken language:

- Include activities with: Rhyming, Onset Fluency, Blending, Identifying Final or Medial Sounds, Segmenting, Adding Phonemes, Deleting Phonemes, and Substituting Phonemes

Word Work

From Phonics to Reading by Wiley Blevins

- Follows a systematic scope and sequence designed to promote early reading and writing.
- Incorporates explicit, research based phonics instruction that embody the Seven Characteristics of Strong Phonics Instruction: Readiness Skills, Scope and Sequence, Blending, Dictation, Word Awareness, High Frequency Words, and Reading Connected Text



Each Friday students will be assessed on
the 5 high frequency words, 5 words
that follow the pattern, and 2 dictation
sentences.
